ORDINANCE 2022-02

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF BRIDGE CITY, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION WITH OTHER ENTERGY SERVICE AREA CITIES IN MATTERS CONCERNING ENTERGY TEXAS, INC. AT THE PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION OF TEXAS IN 2022; AUTHORIZING THE HIRING OF LAWYERS AND RATE EXPERTS; AUTHORIZING THE CITY'S PARTICIPATION TO THE FULL EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW AT THE PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION OF TEXAS; FINDING THAT THE MEETING COMPLIES WITH THE OPEN MEETINGS ACT; AND DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, Cities have exclusive original jurisdiction over rates, operations, and services of an electric utility in areas in the municipality pursuant to *Tex. Util. Code* § 33.001; and

WHEREAS, Cities have standing in each case before the Public Utility Commission of Texas that relates to an electric utility providing service in the municipality pursuant to *Tex. Util. Code* § 33.025; and

WHEREAS, Entergy Texas, Inc. (“ETI” or “Company”) is expected to litigate rate change requests in various proceedings before the Public Utility Commission of Texas (“Commission”) or before municipalities in 2022, which may include (1) a base rate case, (2) rate proceedings or cost adjustments such as a transmission cost recovery rider, a distribution cost recovery rider, a generation cost recovery rider, energy efficiency cost recovery factor, or hurricane restoration cost or offset true-ups, (3) and various fuel cost refunds or surcharges and reconciliations; and

WHEREAS, ETI is expected to file a statement of intent to increase its base rates with municipalities and the Commission in 2022; and

WHEREAS, ETI is scheduled to file fuel factor proceedings at the Commission in February and August 2022, and may file other fuel proceedings to reconcile, refund, or surcharge fuel charges; and

WHEREAS, ETI is expected to file its annual proceeding with the Commission to recover costs incurred in association with its Energy Efficiency Plan as well as reconcile past costs; and

WHEREAS, Cities have the statutory right to set fair and reasonable rates for both the Company and customers within Cities; and

WHEREAS, Cities are entitled to reimbursement by the utility of their reasonable rate case expenses to participate in cases that are deemed rate proceedings pursuant to *Tex. Util. Code* § 33.023.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRIDGE CITY, TEXAS, that:

SECTION 1. The City of Bridge City shall participate with other Cities to intervene in ETI's various rate filings related to the various fuel cost surcharges and reconciliations, any interim or incremental surcharge proceedings or surcharge adjustments, and for any base rate adjustment proceedings or cost of service adjustments on file with the Commission or with municipalities in 2022.

SECTION 2. The City of Bridge City employs the Lawton Law Firm P.C. to represent the City regarding the ETI rate matters before local regulatory authorities and the Commission and any court of law and authorizes counsel to employ rate experts as are recommended by the Cities' Steering Committee to intervene in fuel or rate related proceedings at the Commission concerning ETI's rates charged to Texas customers.

SECTION 3. All such actions shall be taken pursuant to the direction of the Cities' Steering Committee. Cities' Steering Committee shall have authority to retain rate consultants and lawyers. Cities' Steering Committee shall direct the actions of Cities' representatives in the above proceedings. The Steering Committee is directed to obtain reimbursement from ETI of all reasonable expenses associated with participation in said proceedings.

SECTION 4. The meeting at which this Ordinance was approved was in all things conducted in strict compliance with the Texas Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 551.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be effective from and after the date of its passage.

Re: **Annual Ordinance Authorizing Municipal Participation in Regulatory Proceedings of Entergy Texas, Inc. in 2022**

Dear Steering Committee of Cities located in Entergy Texas, Inc.’s Service Territory:

It is once again time to authorize municipal participation in regulatory rate proceedings involving Entergy Texas, Inc. (“ETI” or “Company”) before the Public Utility Commission of Texas (“PUCT” or “Commission”). **Attached is a proposed Ordinance for your consideration to authorize participation in rate proceedings in 2022. Please forward the completed Ordinance to us by email at danlawtonlawfirm@gmail.com and molly@mayhallvandervoort.com.**

In 2021, the Steering Committee of Cities continued to play a crucial role in limiting ETI’s various requested rate increases to reasonable revenue levels. Since base rates were last set in December 2018, the Company has filed numerous applications for interim cost recovery such as applications for transmission cost recovery (“TCRF”), distribution cost recovery (“DCRF”), generation cost recovery (“GCRR”), and cost recovery for the Company’s energy efficiency program (“EECRF”). The Company also filed an application to securitize approximately \$253 million in system restoration costs for damages related to Hurricanes Laura and Delta and Winter Storm Uri. Cities’ participation in these proceedings was instrumental in keeping the Company’s rates just and reasonable.

On January 1, 2021, ETI placed into service its newly-constructed Montgomery County Power Station, a 993-megawatt combined cycle gas turbine plant adjacent to the Lewis Creek

power plant in Willis, Texas. The Company sought to begin recovery of the cost of the plant through a Generation Cost Recovery Rider (“GCRR”) in late 2020, with several updates filed throughout 2021. We participated in the GCRR proceedings to ensure that Company’s proposed rates were consistent with PURA and the Commission’s Rules, and also to ensure that the Company properly adjusted its GCRR after it sold a small portion of the Montgomery County Power Station to East Texas Electric Cooperative, Inc. in June 2021.

We anticipate that 2022 will be a very busy year. First, ETI is required to file a base rate case by mid-2022 due to the size of its GCRR recovery. The base rate proceedings will include reconciliation and review of the Company’s DCRF, TCRF, and GCRR recoveries. Second, we believe the Company may file a fuel reconciliation case this year, which will include fuel costs incurred during Winter Storm Uri in February 2021. We will review these costs carefully to ensure that they are reasonable and fair to customers. Third, the Company is expected to file its annual application to amend its Energy Efficiency Cost Recovery Factor and its semi-annual Fuel Factor rate adjustments in February and August 2022. Finally, depending on the timing of ETI’s base rate case, ETI may seek rate revenue increases through the TCRF, DCRF, and GCRR cost recovery mechanisms in late 2022.

The continued support of each of the Cities in the Steering Committee has been instrumental in the successful regulation of ETI and in maintaining reasonable rates for customers within the Cities. We look forward to each City’s continued participation with the Steering Committee in the regulatory process. **Please forward completed Ordinances to us by email at danlawtonlawfirm@gmail.com and molly@mayhallvandervoort.com.**

Mayor Rutledge presented Lucy Fields with an award showing the City Council's appreciation of her years of dedication and service to the City of Bridge City.

6. STUDENT RECOGNITION

(a) *Recognizing Bridge City students for their accomplishments*

Mayor Rutledge recognized the Bridge City High School Marching Band for being an UIL State Qualifier.

7. REPORTS AND COMMENTS FROM:

(a) *City Manager*

City Manager Jerry Jones had the following report for Council:

1. Mr. Jones said his report would be really short since it was his last one. He thanked the Council and said it has been an honor to serve with them. He said on a good note the

City received the new Gradall today. He then turned it over to Mike Lund to give the report.

Mike Lund reported:

1. Yard sewer lines – the contractors were able to do a few, but they are still on track and would be done in a month or two. The holidays have slowed the project down.
2. Manholes on East Roundbunch – still waiting on one more bid. Mr. Lund said when he receives that bid, he would be able to set a repair date.
3. Ground storage tank – still moving along.

5. He told Mr. Jones it was an honor working with him for the last 20 years. Mr. Lund told Mr. Jones he appreciated him as well as everyone in the water, sewer, street and drainage departments.

(b.) City Council Report

He told Mr. Jones it has been great working with him for the last 14/15 years. He said he really appreciated everything Mr. Jones had done for the Council and the City.

Council Member Tammi Fiset told Mr. Jones congratulations on his retirement. She told him she appreciates everything he had done for the City. She said she wished him the very best. She told Ms Fields it has been an honor. She said she enjoyed working along side of her for several years. She told Ms. Fields she appreciated everything she had done and she looked forward to having Shelley. She told the Band Directors what an awesome job and she was so proud of the Bridge City Band. She thanked the Drum Majors and everyone in the band. She said she was a band parent and knows exactly what it was like and to go everywhere and do everything. She said thank you for what you do and for representing the City.

Council Member Danny Harrington said he would like to wish everyone there a Happy New Year. He said he hopes everyone can have a year with less stripe than we had last year. He said we were getting off to a good start by having the band honored like they have been. He told Ms. Fields, which he considers her a very close friend, it was a great way to start the year on a positive note. He said for the last 3 years, Mr. Jones has been very patient with him, and he appreciates the support he has given him.

Council Member Terri Gauthier said she did not realize this was Mr. Jones last meeting. She said she would like to start off thanking Mr. Jones for all he has done for her. She said many times they have sat and have had conversations which he answered her questions she had. She said he definitely had been her mentor and she appreciates that so much. She told Mr. Jones he would definitely be missed, and they have all grown to appreciate and admire his dedication to the City. She said congratulations to you and Sherlon since she has retired and the two of you would get to go do more fun things together. JOINT ELECTION AGREEMENT SERVICES CONTRACT

II PREAMBLE

1.01. Parties. This Joint Election Services Contract is entered into by and between Orange County Elections Administrator/Representative (the “Administrator/Representative”), and the following political subdivisions of the State of Texas (the “Entities”).

The City of Orange, City of Pinehurst, City of Vidor, City of Pine Forest, City of Bridge City, City of Rose City

West Orange –Cove CISD, Little Cypress-Mauriceville CISD, Bridge City ISD, Vidor ISD, Orangefield ISD

Orange County Drainage District, Orange County Navigation & Port District, Orange County Emergency District 1, Orange County Emergency District 2, Orange County Emergency District 3, Orange County Emergency District 4, Mauriceville Utility District, Orange County Water District 1 and Orange County Water District 2.

1.02. Statutory Authority. The Parties are entitled to enter into this contract pursuant to the Texas Election Code ' 31.092.

1.03 Purpose. The purpose of this contract is to authorize the Administrator/Representative to conduct and supervise the Entities’ General Election to be held on the 7th day of May, 2022, and a possible run-off election on 25th day of June, 2022.

1.04. Consideration. The Parties enter into this contract based upon the mutual covenants and agreements set forth within the body of this contract.

II OBLIGATIONS OF THE ADMINISTRATOR/REPRESENTATIVE

2.01. The Administrator/Representative shall assume the following responsibilities on behalf of the Entities:

- a) Serve as early voting clerk for the 2022 May General Election and any resulting 2022 Run-Off Election.
- b) Supervise the conducting of early voting as well as procure the location and personnel to conduct the early voting as the case may be. This also includes processing requests from voters for ballots by mail.

- c) Provide general overall supervision of the election and, further, generally advise the entities with respect to miscellaneous issues arising before and during the conduct of the election.
- d) Procure and provide ballots needed for election.
- e) Prepare and provide ballot boxes, locks and keys for early voting and election day.
- f) Store ballots for the 22-month retention period.
- g) Procure and distribute election supplies, including the preparation of election kits and distribution of ballots. In this regard, the Administrator/Representative shall also purchase the supplies and print the ballots for use in the electronic voting machine "Express Votes" required under the Help America Vote Act ("HAVA").
- h) Procure, prepare, and distribute election equipment.
- i) Publish notice of the date, time, and place of a school of instruction for election judges and clerks, and to, further assume responsibility for conducting any such school.
- j) Appoint and notify election judges and alternate judges of their appointment for election day and early voting.
- k) Arrange for the use of polling places for election day and early voting.
- l) Provide information services for voters and election officers during early voting and election day.
- m) Prepare list of registered voters required for use in early voting and election day, if needed.
- n) Shall conduct all logic and accuracy testing in accordance with the procedures set forth by the Texas Secretary of State.
- o) Shall prepare and publish any required notices of such testing.
- p) Arrange for the use of tabulating personnel needed at the central counting station in preparation for tabulation of the ballots.
- q) Supervise the handling, counting and disposition of election returns to the entities and assist in preparing the tabulation for the official canvass.
- r) On the evening of election day, after the polls have closed, report to the entities the results of early voting, and of all regular voting as the ballots and/or tabulations are delivered to the office of the administrator by or on behalf of the election judges, for the purpose of allowing the entities to report such election results to the election candidate(s), public and news media.
- s) Assist the entities in the official canvassing of election returns.
- t) Provide bilingual services for early voting and on election day for the entities at a cost not to exceed \$150.00.

III. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ENTITY

3.01 The Entities shall assume the following responsibilities in conjunction with the provision of elections services under this contract and shall assume all costs associated with performance of its responsibilities under the contract as follows:

- a) Prepare all required preclearance submissions to the Department of Justice.
- b) Prepare election orders, resolutions, notices and other related documents for approval or adoption by the Entities as the case may be.
- c) Accept all candidate filings for place on the ballot and provide information to the Administrator/Representative.

- d) Prepare and provide ballot layout to Elections Administrator/Representative. (The Entities must sign off on proof of ballot from ES&S before they are printed.)
- e) Post the publication of election notices.
- f) Pick up all election related material except ballots.

3.02. Payment of Administrative Fees and Costs. The Entities shall be assessed, and shall pay to the Administrator/Representative an administrative fee equal to ten percent (10%) of the total cost of conducting the election or a minimum fee of \$75.00, and performance of all other responsibilities and duties as set forth in this contract.

As soon as reasonably possible after the election, the Administrator/Representative will Submit an itemized invoice to the Entities for actual costs and expenses directly attributable to coordination, supervision, and conducting of the election.

The Entities will be responsible for paying any and all cost incurred by the Administrator/Representative to conduct the election set out in the itemized invoice after the election. Itemized cost will be based on percentage of registered voter in each entity.

IV. GENERAL PROVISIONS

4.01. Number of Voting Locations. There shall be (____) voting locations, plus ____ early voting locations established for purposes of this election.

4.02. Hold Harmless. The Entities shall hold harmless the Administrator/Representative, as well as the department, from any and all claims made arising out of an act and/or omission of the Entities to perform its obligations under the contract. Further, the Administrator/Representative shall hold harmless the Entities, its employees, agents and officials from any and all acts and/or omissions arising out of the failure by the Administrator/Representative to perform the obligations under the contract.

4.03. Copies of Contract. The Administrator/Representative shall file copies of this contract with the Orange County Treasurer and the Orange County Auditor. The Entities shall maintain a copy of this Contract on file at its principal office.

4.04. Texas Law To Apply. Texas law shall apply to the contract.

4.05. Venue. Venue for any dispute arising out of the performance of any obligation set forth in this Contract shall lie in Orange County, Texas.
